Programme (U.G) Course Outcome

CORE- I: UNDERSTANDING POLITICAL THEORY

- a. It introduces the students to the idea of political theory, its history and approaches, and an assessment of its critical and contemporary trends.
- b. It is designed to reconcile political theory and practice through reflections on the ideas and practices related to democracy.

CORE- II: CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT AND DEMOCRACY IN INDIA

- a. This course acquaints students with the constitutional design of state structures and institutions, and their actual working over time.
- b. It further encourages a study of state institutions in their mutual interactions.

CORE-3: POLITICAL THEORY-CONCEPTS AND DEBATES

- a. It helps the student familiarize with the basic normative concepts of political theory.
- b. It introduces the students to the important debates in the subject.

CORE-4: POLITICAL PROCESS IN INDIA

- a. This course maps the working of modern institutions and their role in the contemporary society.
- b. It also familiarizes students with the working of the Indian state, paying attention to the contradictory dynamics of modern state power.

CORE- V: INTRODUCTION TO COMPARATIVE GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS

- a. The purpose of this course is to familiarize students with the basic concepts and approaches to the study of comparative politics.
- b. The course will specifically focus on examining politics in a historical framework while engaging with various themes of comparative analysis in developed and developing countries.

CORE- VI: PERSPECTIVES ON PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

- a. The course explores various mechanisms of administrative system.
- b. The course will also attempt to provide the students a comprehensive understanding on contemporary administrative developments.

CORE- VII: PERSPECTIVES ON INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND WORLD HISTORY

- a. It introduces students to some of the most important theoretical approaches for studying international relations.
- b. It provides a fairly comprehensive overview of the major political developments and events starting from the twentieth century.

CORE - VIII: POLITICAL PROCESSES AND INSTITUTIONS IN COMPARATIVE PERSPECTIVE

- a. This course highlights the application of comparative methods to the study of politics.
- b. The course also aims to introduce to some of the range of issues, literature, and methods that cover comparative politics.

CORE-IX: PUBLIC POLICY AND ADMINISTRATION IN INDIA

- a. The paper seeks to provide an introduction to the interface between public policy and administration in India.
- b. It deals with issues of decentralization, financial management, citizens and administration and social welfare.

CORE- X: GLOBAL POLITICS

- a. This course introduces students to the key debates on the meaning and nature of globalization by addressing its political, economic, social, cultural and technological dimensions.
- b. It imparts an understanding of the working of the world economy and analyse changing nature of relationship between the state and trans-national actors and networks.

CORE- XI: CLASSICAL POLITICAL PHILOSOPHY

- a. This course introduces about western political philosophy.
- b. This course highlights about ideal state, social contract theory, dual morality and Marxism.

CORE- XII: INDIAN POLITICAL THOUGHT-I

- a. This course introduces the specific elements of Indian Political Thought.
- b. The course is meant to provide a sense of the broad streams of Indian thought while encouraging a specific knowledge of individual thinkers and texts.

CORE- XIII: MODERN POLITICAL PHILOSOPHY

- a. This course highlights about modern political thinkers.
- b. It also highlights about several modern ideologies and its criticism.

DSE-1- INTRODUCTION TO HUMAN RIGHTS

- a. This course attempts to build an understanding of human rights among students through a study of specific issues in a comparative perspective.

DSE-2 -DEVELOPMENT PROCESS AND SOCIAL MOVEMENTS IN CONTEMPORARY INDIA

- a. This course proposes to introduce students to the conditions, contexts and forms of political contestation over development paradigms and their bearing on the retrieval of democratic voice of citizens.
